Congratulations to Michelle Kocurek for being awarded one of the Heart in Hand Awards at this year's Seminar in Sugar Land. Here is the write up for her nomination.

- Michelle took on the task of Technology chair this year which encompasses our DNTG Gmail and zoom accounts, our website and Facebook page.
- This summer she did an intensive review of all SCR websites and redesigned the DNTG website www.DNTG.org to be more informative and userfriendly (she had to learn our website software). It now includes an interactive calendar, information on our events, workshops, membership, meeting locations, our new charm program, maps, show 'n tell, DNTG state fair winners, DNTG's annual ReTreat, SCR and EGA seminars, newsletters, and a "members only" section that is password protected for our directory and forms.
- Michelle worked with Judy McGraw, our Membership chair, to create a digital version of our membership directory. We no longer have to print this for the membership. A version was created for computers and another for cell phones.
- The DNTG Facebook page was created by an individual member which caused issues with postings so she deleted our old page, created a Facebook page with DNTG as the owner and then created a private Facebook Group page for Dallas Needlework where all of our members can post what they're working on. Michelle updates this each month with our Show 'N Tell, upcoming event information, social media posts, etc. Our goal was to

get 100 members for our group page. As of March, we had 115+ members and it continues to grow.

- This year we started advertising on Facebook.
 Michelle helped post and promote the ads on
 our Facebook page and Group page. She
 developed a social media calendar to make sure
 DNTG posts suitable content on a regular basis.
 2023 Heart and Hand Award South Central
 Region Embroiderers' Guild of America
- Michelle suggested and worked with the treasurer to make Zelle payments available for members.
- This year we participated in the Sewing Expo –
 we shared a booth with Ft. Worth EGA and
 Greater Dallas to promote DNTG/EGA to the
 general public. Michelle helped with this event.
- Michelle contacted the Houston Embroidery Guild chapter to discuss their charm program. She worked with Paige Guillory to develop a similar program for DNTG. It increased participation across the board at all events. After the pandemic, sew day attendance was often less than 10 people – general meetings were board members plus 1 or 2 others. DNTG now has an average of 20 people at sew days and 30 at our general meetings. DNTG has also seen an increase in participation in all of our events: workshops, education classes, Stitch-inpublic day, chapter stitch-a-long, annual sampler project, and MAGIC to name a few. This was a great relatively lowcost program that made a significant impact for our organization.
- The sewing Expo brought in 2 new members, Facebook ad campaigns brought in 16, a new library display program (promoted on the

Catherine Theron Two-Day Workshop Tri-Fold Carnation Sewing Case October 25-26, 2023

Carnations in flower lore represent maternal love. This pocket-sized case, worked on 32-count linen with silk threads in shades of red and green with accents in brown, highlights some of the varied shapes and counted stitches used throughout history to depict the carnation.

The front cover has a single stylized carnation. The back and inner covers


feature variations of this flower. Two diagonal inside pockets feature more stylized depictions of the carnation, and the final inner panel holds a pin cushion. A Queen Stitch scissor fob finishes off the carnation theme. The two spine areas are used for personalization.

Stitches include Queen, Florentine, Outline, Smyrna Cross, Satin Cushion, Double Running, Petit Point, Palestrina Knot, Satin, and Cross Stitch over One.

Poppy Seed Cake From Cyndi Scott

RECIPE -

Poppy Seed Cake

- 1 package yellow cake mix
- 1 package <u>instant</u> vanilla pudding mix Add:
- 2/3 cup oil (Crisco or your favorite)
- 4 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

1/4 cup poppyseeds soaked in 2/3 cup hot water (just to soften them, about 5 minutes)

Mix all together. Pour into a bundt pan or angelfood cake pan.

Bake at 350 for 40 to 45 minutes or until knife inserted in the center comes out clean.

Let cool slightly. Loosen edges and invert onto serving plate.



The Royal School of Needlework has created an online resource for finding stitches. Here is the information that they posted on their website: https://www.rsnstitchbank.org/

The **Royal School of Needlework** was founded in 1872 with a mission to preserve the art of hand embroidery.

To mark its 150th anniversary the RSN is launching the **RSN Stitch Bank** to continue this mission. The RSN Stitch Bank aims to digitally conserve and showcase the wide variety of the world's embroidery stitches and the ways in which they have been used in different cultures and times.

Launching with an initial 150 stitches, the RSN Stitch Bank is an ongoing project. More stitches will be added regularly and the RSN will be working with partners around the world to include stitches from different traditions.

For each stitch we need to:

- Film and edit a video demonstrating the making of the stitches.
- Create step by step text, illustrations, and photos of the stitch's construction.
- Research a short history of the stitch and its use.
- Create an icon to help identify a stitch at a glance.
- Classify the stitch according to the taxonomy we are developing for the project.
- Select items from the RSN Collection which show this stitch in use and photograph the piece as a whole and of the stitch close up.


