## From the President

I was so excited to see all of our guests at the September coffee. Everyone introduced themselves and talked about how they got into stitching. It made me think about my story.

My mother sewed most of our clothes when we were young, and we often had matching dresses for special occasions like Easter. When I was eight years old, my mom embroidered blue jean shirts for us three girls. We got to pick out

the designs we wanted on our shirts. She used this project to introduce me and my sisters to embroidery. We learned a few stitches and did a little work on the shirts. Believe it or not, we all still have our shirts!

It was the 70s so my mom mainly did crewel embroidery. The piece I remember most is a girl on a swing with 3D pigtails coming off the fabric. I thought that was so cool as a kid. Fast forward to the 80s and my older sister Michelle was in college. She joined a sorority and moved into the house. There she picked up cross-stich from her new sisters. And she brought it home to me and Jennifer. My first piece was my initial. But it wasn't my last.

I really enjoyed cross-stitching in college and when I first started working. I mostly stitched items to give as gifts. Michelle moved to Florida and back to Plano in the 90s. Upon her return, a friend introduced her to DNTG and EGA. Wow!! Who knew something like this existed? I joined a year after Michelle and my first experience was ReTreat. What an awesome event to see what everyone is working on. There were so many different types of stitching!

It was a few years before I ventured out of my comfort zone and started taking classes. Since I've joined DNTG, I've learned how to do black work, needlepoint, hardanger, pulled thread, beaded bags/boxes, 3D beading, goldwork, thread painting, Japanese beaded embroidery, wool felting, wool applique, ribbon embroidery, finishing techniques, how to make a tassel/cording, soutache jewelry, and much more. My current new adventure is stumpwork. There's a lot of opportunities to expand your horizons in DNTG and EGA. Don't be afraid to try something new.

Everyone is a beginner when they are learning something new. So, if you have a question or need help ask! Everyone I've met in DNTG loves to share their knowledge and experiences stitching. You may even come away with some cool tips.

I look forward to stitching with you and hopefully, I'll see you in a class.

## **October Program**

As a founding member of the team who brought the EGA Facebook Stitch-a-long program to life, Kate Gaunt shared a number of terrific projects with EGA members. Kate will join us for our October 2022 general meeting where she will present on overview of her project, Aztec Scissors Case. This piece features the unusual and graphic Aztec stitch, which isn't difficult but is unique in the method used. This stitch is often found on Mexican samplers.

Supplies needed for this project include:

- 18-ct mono canvas cut size 6" x 12" (orientation doesn't matter – just use the same dimensions) (Kate used ecru)
- Threads:
  - One ball (partial) #8 pearl cotton --Kate used ecru (DMC) to match her canvas
  - Four skeins #5 pearl cotton (DMC).Kate used :
    - 825 (blue)
    - 907 (lime green)
    - 727 (yellow)
    - 740 (orange)
- 6" x 12" stretcher bars and brass tacks

The focus of our October program will be to review the instructions for the project with Kate providing her insight on successfully navigating the Aztec stitch. Instructions for the project can be downloaded from the EGA website through the links below:

# November 10 Program Perforated Paper Needlework 1840 - 1900 By Claudia Dutch Kistler



This lecture will share with you the creativity of counted thread pieces worked on specific "fabric" that was once very popular but is almost forgotten today. Between 1840 and 1900 a popular needlework pastime for both children and adults was stitching on perforated paper. In this lecture you will see an overview of the history and different types of perforated paper needlework. You will see some amazing technique and creativity in these antique pieces that you may not know was possible.

The era of the counted thread linen sampler, with designs worked in cotton or silk on fine fabrics, began to wind down about 1850. By 1870, brightly colored German wools were being used on needlepoint canvas for Berlin work patterns of flowers, animals, and geometric designs. These two types of needlework are very different. Do you ever wonder what happened to bridge the gap between these two familiar types of needlework? Perforated paper, also known as Bristol card, filled that gap. Perforated paper was a cardboard punched with evenly spaced holes that was sold in sheets. Perforated paper could be used for counted thread design, for needlepoint design, and for printed design. By 1860 perforated paper was the common "fabric" for needlework because it was easy to find, affordable, and fun to work. Bristol card allowed for new types of design, offering different creative options that were not successful on fabric or canvas. Stitchers began to choose paper over fabric, magazines offered counted thread paper projects, and designers began to offer printed pieces.

This lecture presents an overview of three categories of perforated paper needlework: The Smalls [1840-1860]; The Samplers [1840 – 1870]; and The Mottoes [1870-1900]. You will see examples from Claudia's extensive collection of perforated paper pieces. Some of the samplers reveal history about the maker, and Claudia will share those stories with you.

## Jane Nicholas Corncockle and Dragonfly Workshop

Corncockle and Dragonfly workshop on September 20 and 21, 2022 with 18 students. The students learned stumpwork techniques, surface embroidery, and three dimensional

embroidery. This beautiful design includes detached buds, flowers, leaves, a dragonfly, a blue beetle, and a lady bug.

## Audra Kennedy's *Initials* Workshop Surface and Ribbon Embroidery April 27-28, 2023

Each student will choose their initial prior to class. The designs will be drawn by the instructor onto handkerchief weight linen with a fusible backing. Since every letter has 5-7 flowers in common, those will be the focus of the first day of class. I will also discuss color selections, stitches required, and how to customize the letter if they wish.

The second day will be spent continuing learning the basic flowers and adding those unique to each person's letter.

- 15" x 15" piece of linen with Pellon Shape-Flex interfacing (SF101) applied
- 14" x 14" muslin "dirt cloth" to protect your stitching

- DMC flosses, needles, and complete instructions

Students will be asked to bring an 8 ½" or 10" wooden hoop, scissors and any lighting and magnifiers they feel they need.



The **Royal School of Needlework** was founded in 1872 with a mission to preserve the art of hand embroidery.

To mark its 150th anniversary the RSN is launching the **RSN Stitch Bank** to continue this mission. The RSN Stitch Bank aims to digitally conserve and showcase the wide variety of the world's embroidery stitches and the ways in which they have been used in different cultures and times.

Launching with an initial 150 stitches, the RSN Stitch Bank is an ongoing project. More stitches will be added regularly and the RSN will be working with partners around the world to include stitches from different traditions.

For each stitch we need to:

- Film and edit a video demonstrating the making of the stitches.
- Create step by step text, illustrations and photos of the stitch's construction.
- Research a short history of the stitch and its use.
- Create an icon to help identify a stitch at a glance.
- Classify the stitch according to the taxonomy we are developing for the project.
- Select items from the RSN Collection which show this stitch in use and photograph the piece as a whole and of the stitch close up.


