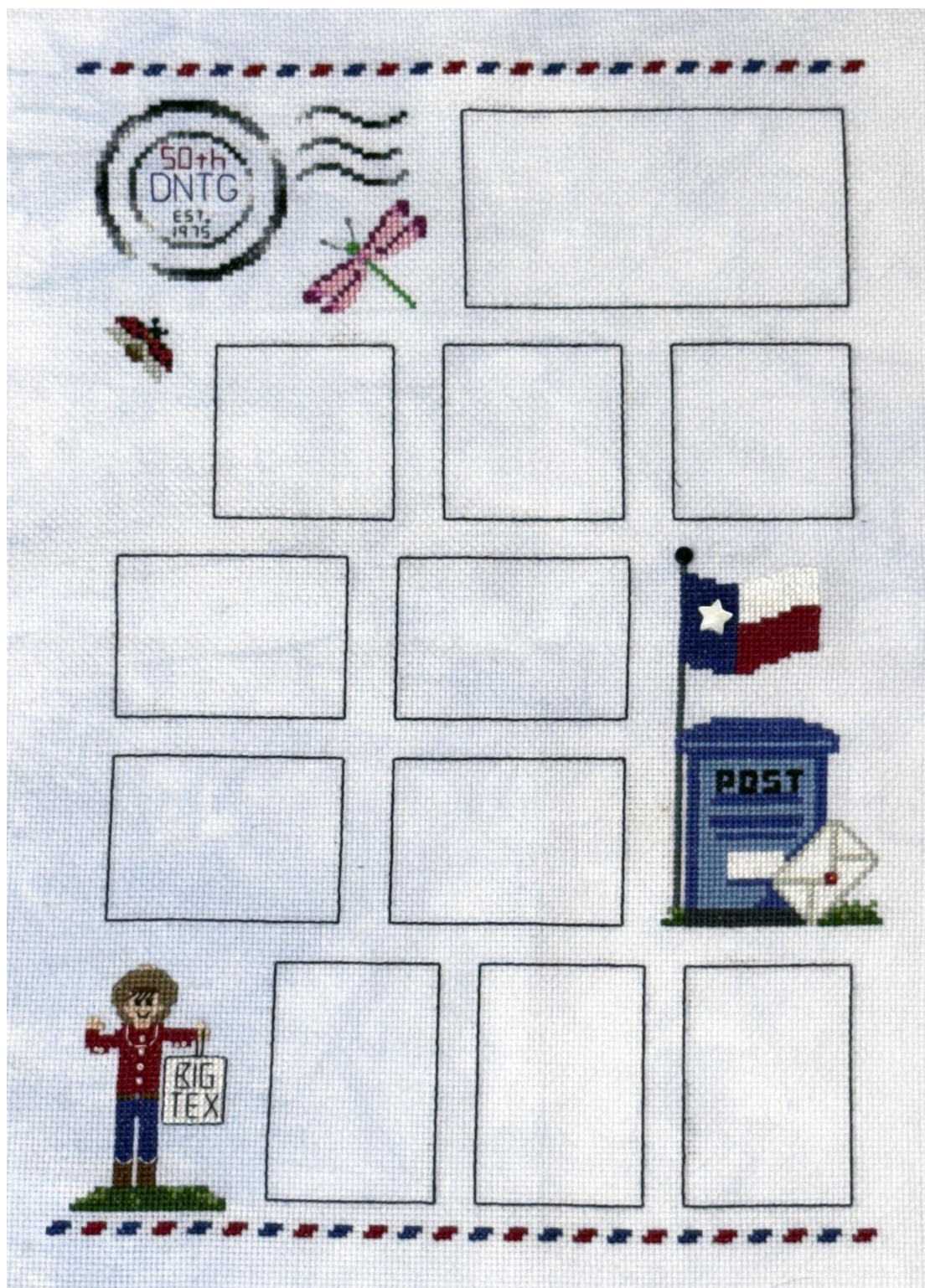


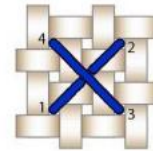


DNTG Texas Wildflowers Stitch-a-Long




General Instructions













- This pattern has three different sized stamps that are interchangeable – square, horizontal and vertical. **You can place the stamps in any of the coordinating spots on your piece.**
- Finished size: 32 ct. linen / 16 ct. Aida – 8.8” x 13.1”
14 ct. Aida – 10.2” x 15”
- All squares on the pattern represent 1x1 on 14/18 ct. Aida and **2x2** (see diagram to the right) **on 32 ct. linen.**
- The Stitch-a-Long (SAL) layout will be released in the May/June newsletter as a separate file. The dragonfly and ladybug on the pattern near the postage mark in the upper left corner are **optional** – you may replace them with any charms or beads from your embellishment pack.
- Beads can also be used in place of French knots on any of the patterns with the exception of the French knots on *Big Tex's* sleeves. Even using 15/0 beads here completely covers the area and you won't be able to see the bottom of his sleeves.
- Stamps will be released monthly beginning in September and ending in February. Bring your finished SAL to be displayed at the May luncheon (2026).
- Use 2 stands of floss for all cross stitches. Stitch all cross stitches on the pattern first.
- All half stitches on the pattern are $\frac{3}{4}$ stitches except for those with outlines. They are $\frac{1}{4}$ stitches.
- Use 1 strand of floss for outlines, French knots, 50th, DNTG, Est. 1975. Stitch outlines after cross stitches are complete. **On the Dallas stamp only:** outline stitches around the buildings are over 2 threads. DMC 906, 3855, and B5200 outlines are **long stitches** – **not** backstitches.
- French knots, button and bead placements are indicated with a circle or oval. The charm on the Dallas skyline is indicated with a box. These items may be attached with 1 strand of a similar color floss or beading thread.
- You may use any of the charms, beads, buttons, etc. from the accessory pack to embellish your piece.
- **Kit includes:** pattern, 32 ct. linen, floss, needles, beads, buttons, and charms.

Stitches

Basic Cross Stitch:

- Thread 1 strand of floss, folded in half, in a #24 Tapestry needle. We'll use the Loop Method to secure your thread.
- Bring the needle up from the back of the fabric at 1.
- Insert the needle into the fabric at 2 (upper right corner). Work your needle through the loop of thread at back. Pull until snug to the fabric.
- Bring the needle up from the back of the fabric at 3 (lower right corner).
- Insert the needle into the fabric at 4 (upper left corner) to complete the stitch.
- For multiple stitches in a row or column, repeat steps 1 & 2 and then complete the stitches by repeating steps 3 & 4. All top stitch threads should slant in the same direction.



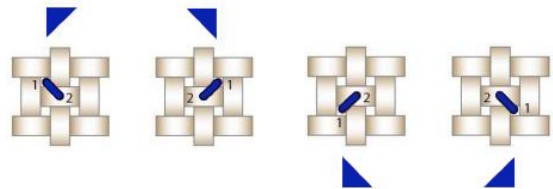
Horizontal Row



Vertical Row

Quarter Stitch (1/4):

- Bring the needle up from the back of the fabric at 1.
- Insert the needle into the fabric at 2.

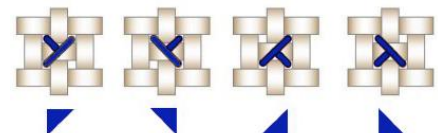


Three Quarter Stitch (3/4):

- In the diagram, bring your needle up from the back at 1 and go down at 2 in the center of your square.
- Come up in the bottom left corner at 3 and down in the upper right corner at 4.



$\frac{3}{4}$ Stitch with one color

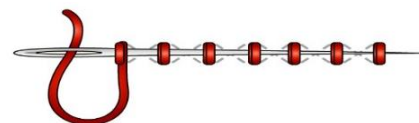


Backstitching:

Bring your needle up at 1 and down at 2. The process is to skip a stitch length, and go back down into the previous stitch (up at 3 and back down into 1).



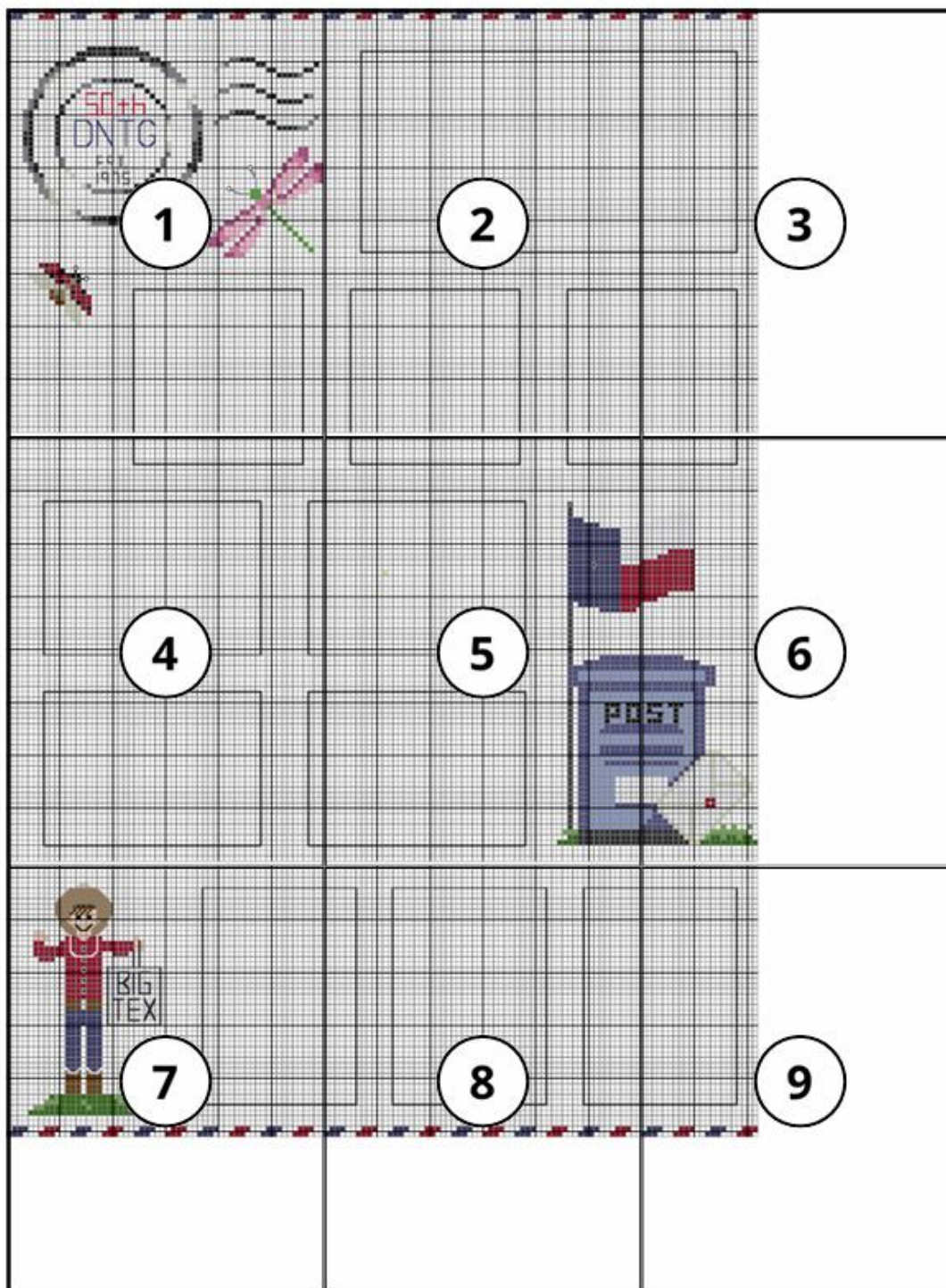
Finishing your Thread:



End your stitching by running the needle under at least 3 threads on the back side of the fabric. Clip your thread close to the stitching.

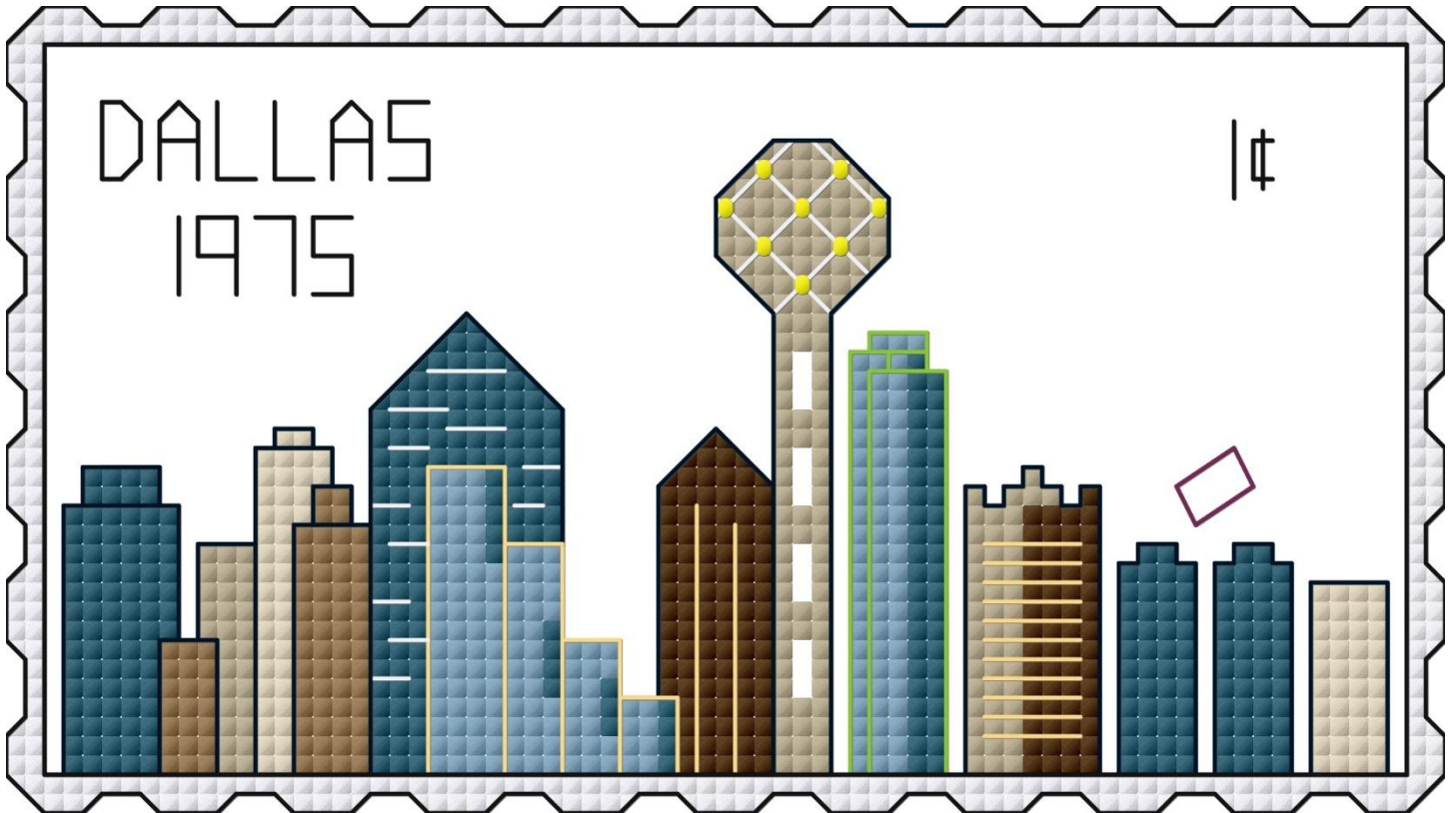

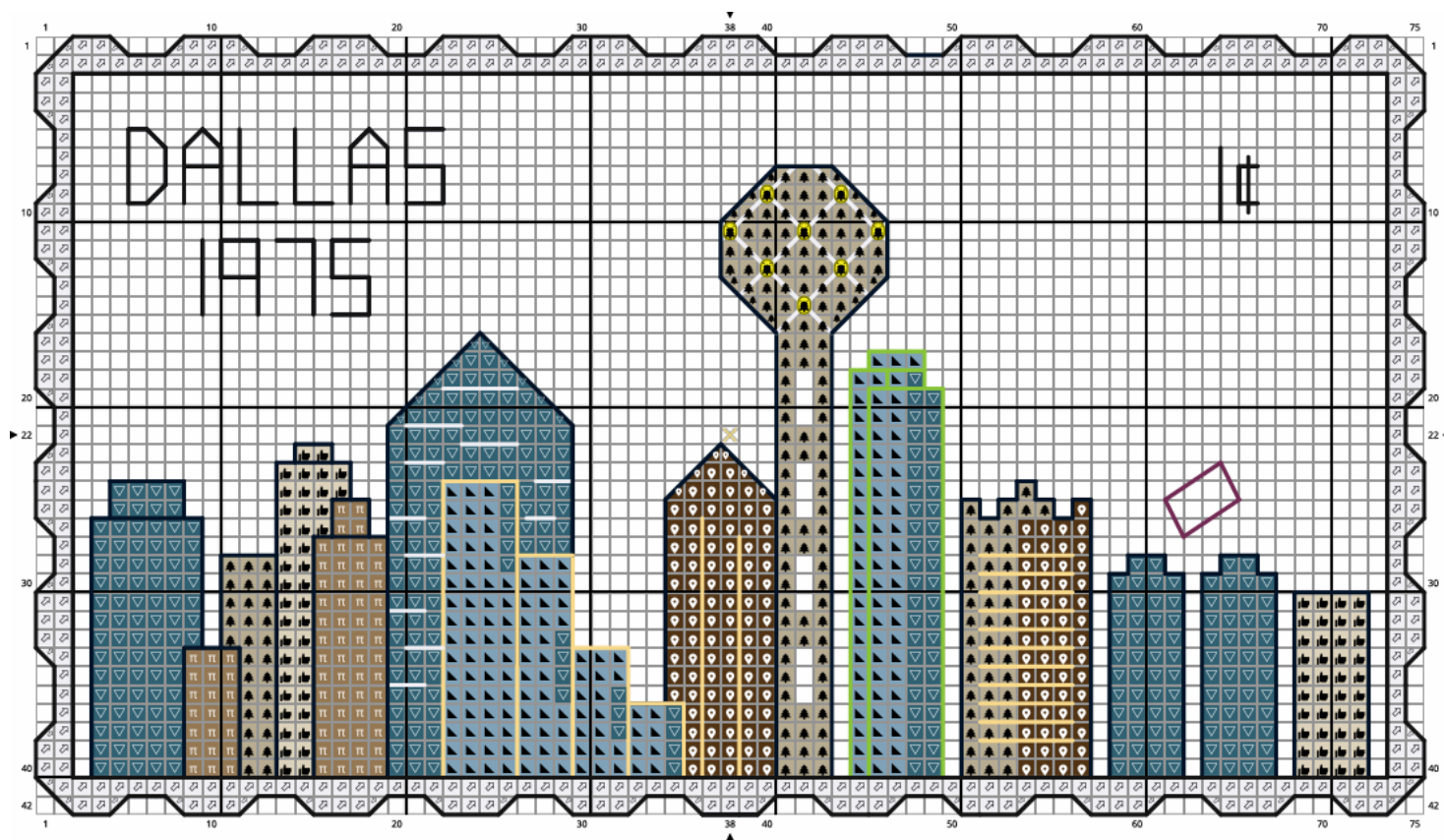
September Stamp







Dallas Skyline –horizontal (top right)



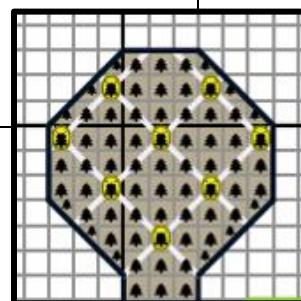
September Stamp – Dallas Skyline

Use 2 strands of floss for all cross stitches. Outlined stitches that look like half stitches are $\frac{1}{4}$ stitches. Backstitching around the buildings (DMC 939) are over 2 threads. Outlines for colors 906, 3855, and B5200 are **long stitches** – **not** backstitches. Use 1 strand of floss for stamp outline (over 1), beads and to attach the Pegasus charm (**purple box** indicates placement).

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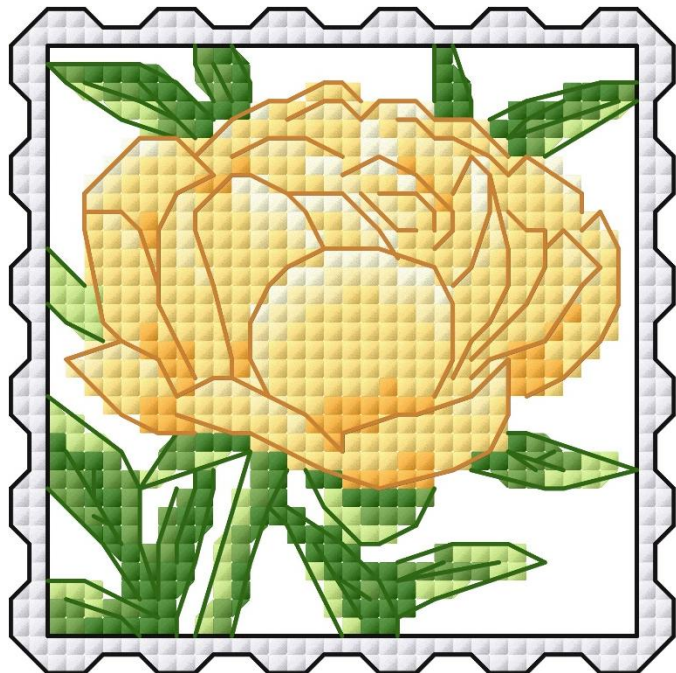

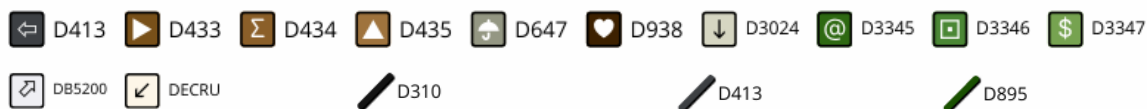
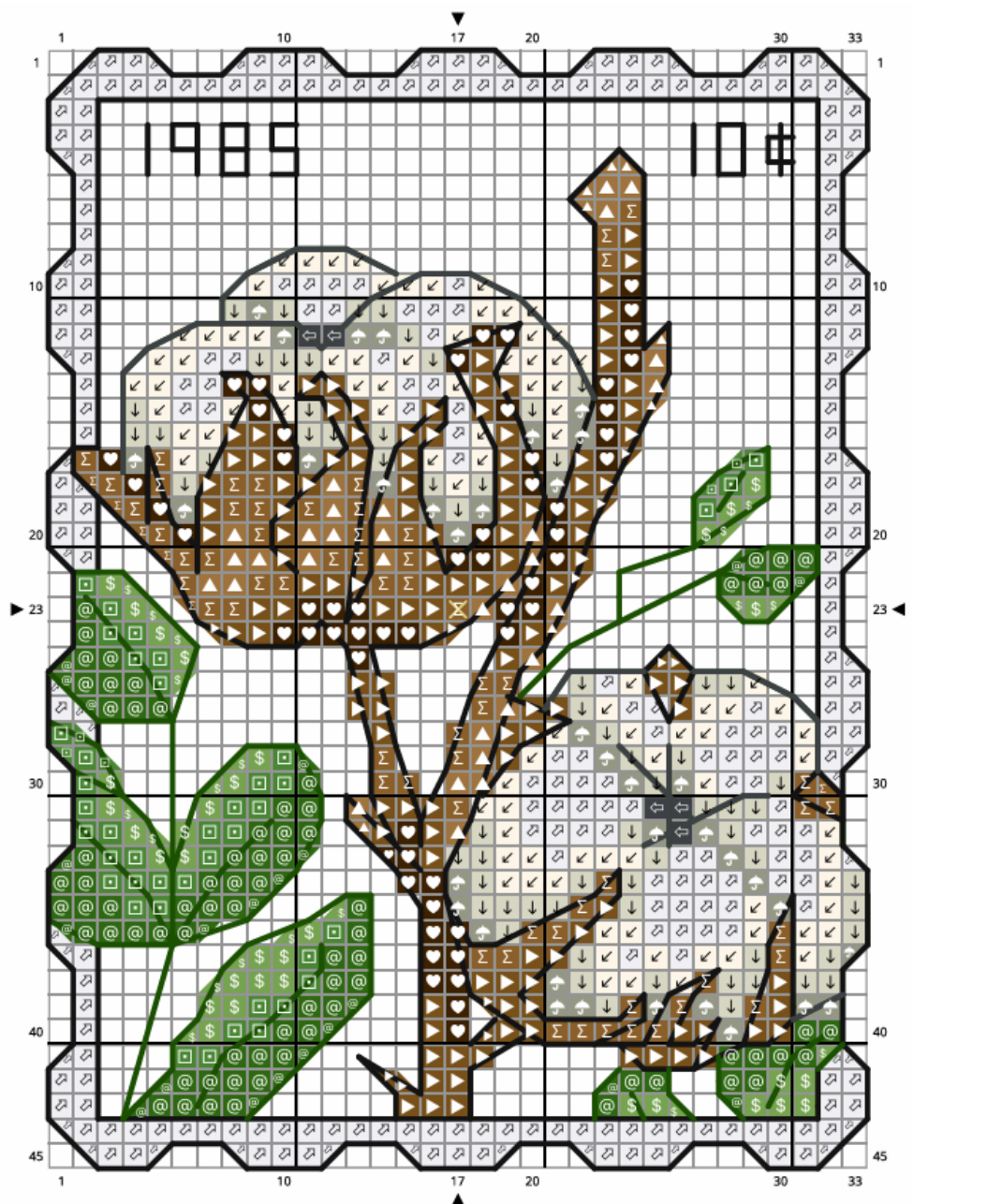
October Stamps

October Stamp – Cotton (vertical block)

Use 2 strands of floss for all cross stitches. Outlined stitches that look like half stitches are $\frac{1}{4}$ stitches. Use 1 strand of floss for outlines.



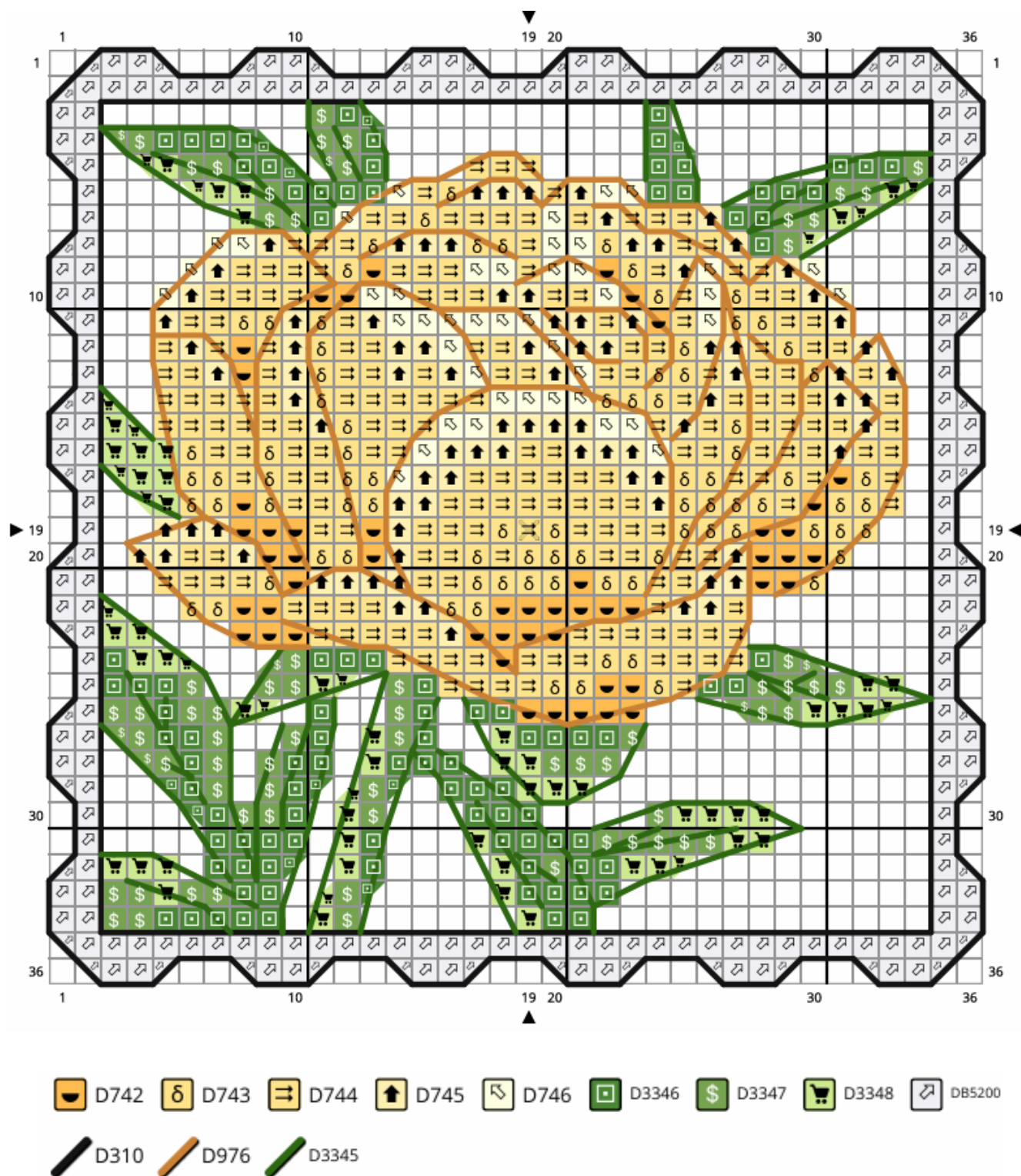

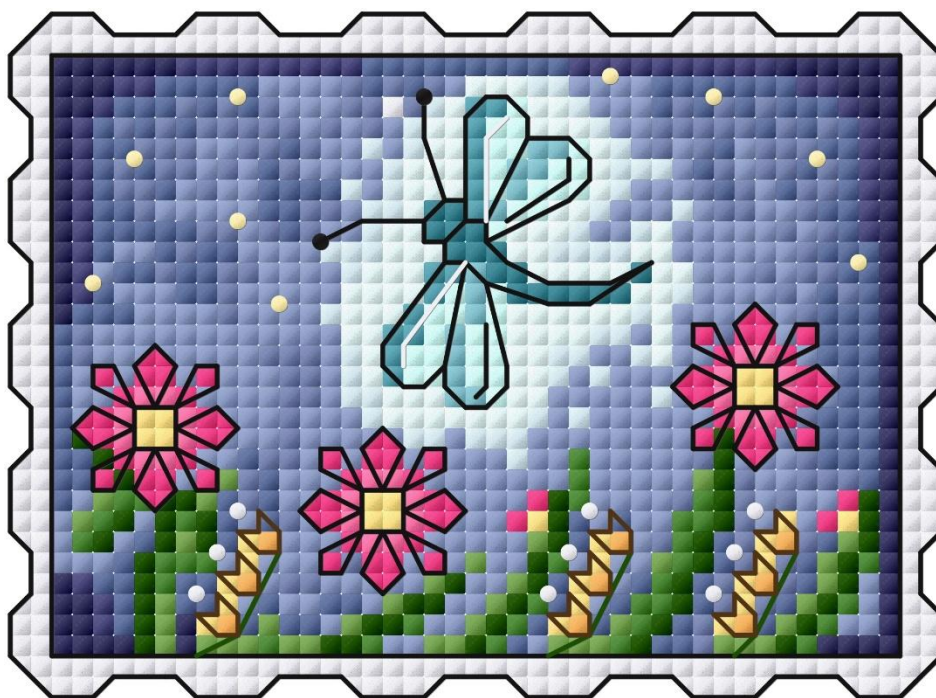
October Stamp – Yellow Rose (square block)

Use 2 strands of floss for all cross stitches. Outlined stitches that look like half stitches are ¼ stitches. Use 1 strand of floss for outlines.

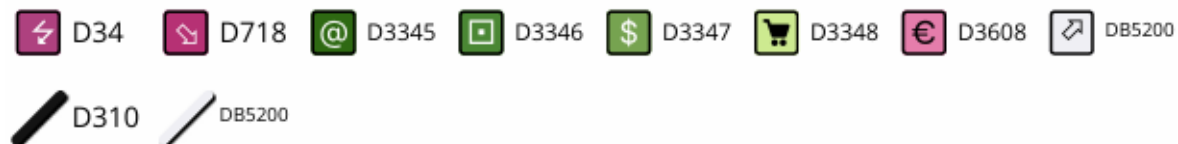


November Stamps

Dragonfly – horizontal

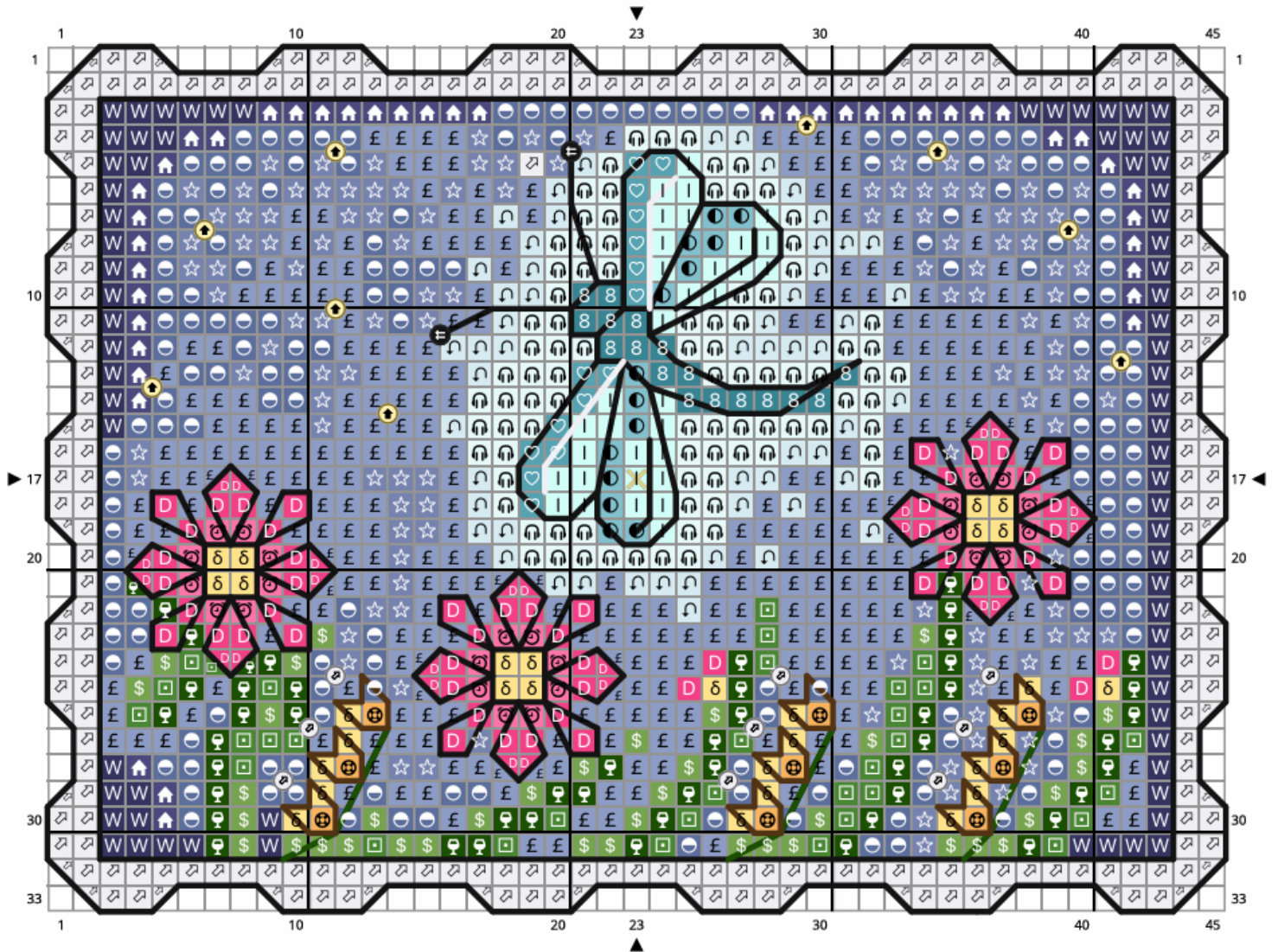


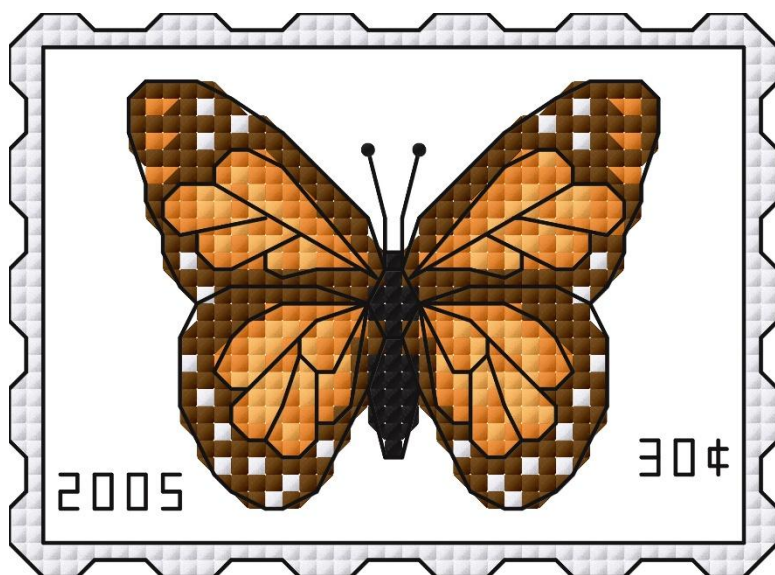
November Stamp – Thistle (square block)



November Stamp – Dragonfly (horizontal block)

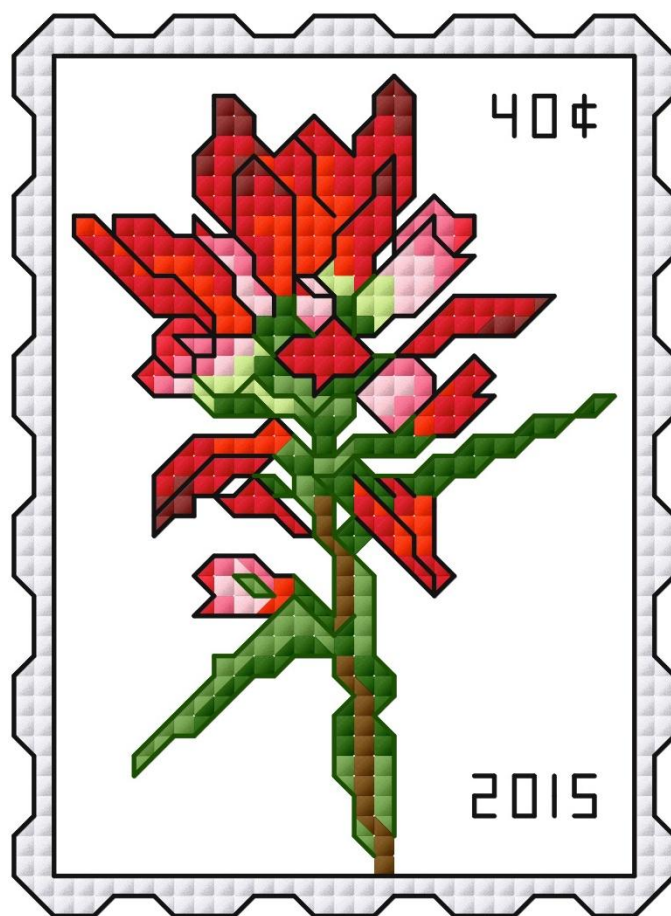
Use 2 strands of floss for all cross stitches. Outlined stitches that look like half stitches are ¼ stitches.
Use 1 strand of floss for outlines and French knots. Beads can be used in place of the French knots.





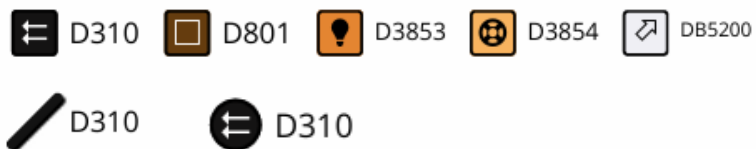
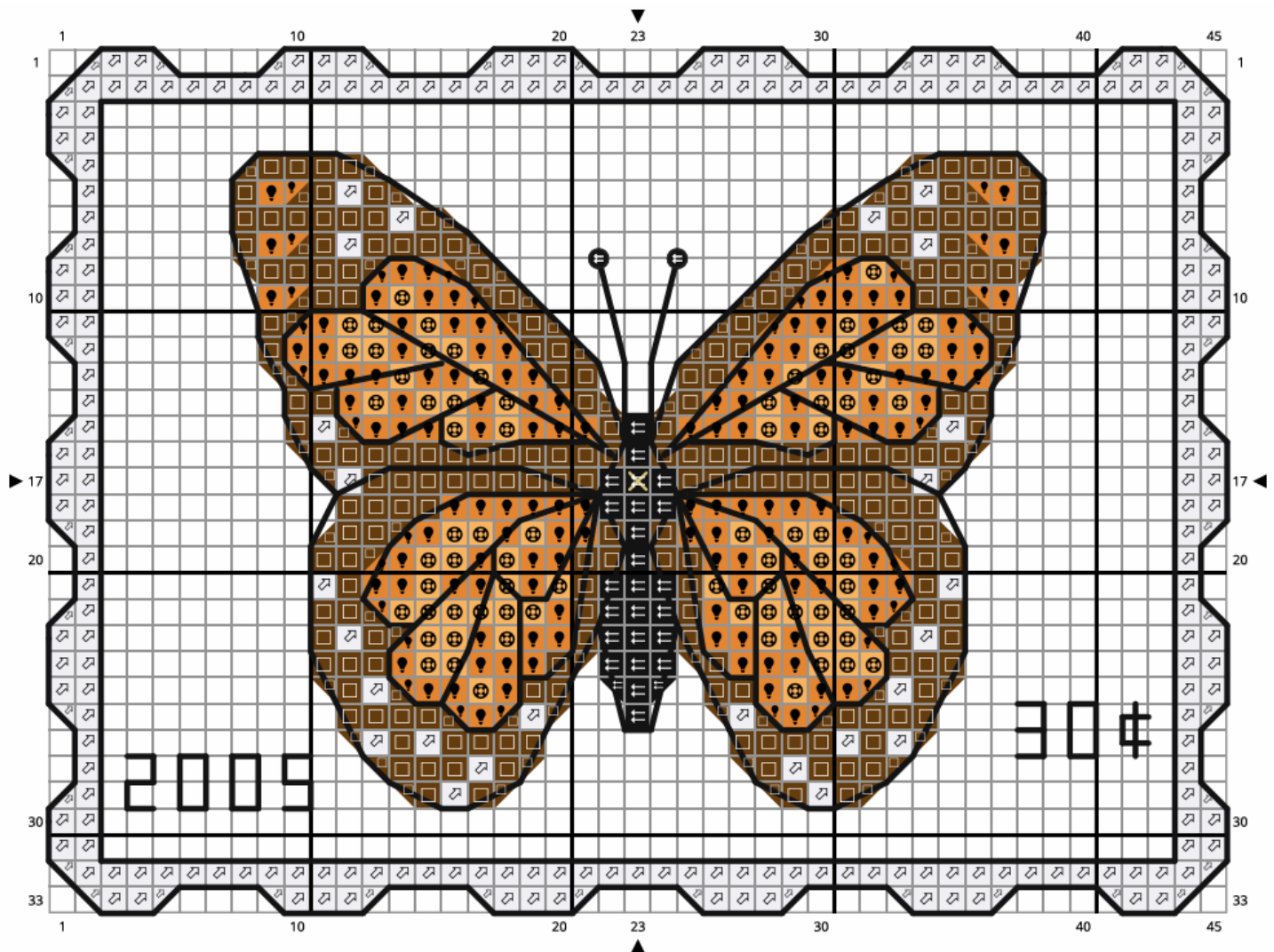
December Stamps

Monarch Butterfly – horizontal
Indian Paintbrush – vertical



December Stamp – Butterfly (horizontal block)

Use 2 strands of floss for all cross stitches. Outlined stitches that look like half stitches are $\frac{1}{4}$ stitches. Use 1 strand of floss for outlines and French knots. You can use black 11/0 beads for the antennae instead of French knots.



December Stamp – Indian Paintbrush (vertical block)

Use 2 strands of floss for all cross stitches. Outlined stitches that look like half stitches are ¼ stitches. Use 1 strand of floss for outlines.
