



It is stitched on 14 count perforated paper with cotton threads. It is charted using Anchor threads. The DMC colors are as follows-

Anchor 2 = white	DMC
13 = Red	817
145 = Lt Blue	813
147 = Blue	824

We will finish these as bookmarks (please see the completed one) and plan to donate them to the host chapter at SCR Seminar in June. They will then give them to a library or a reading program of their choice. Please consider stitching one (or more) and send them to me. We've got a great start! Cyndi Scott

EGA Membership Renewal Changes

- Starting in 2024, all EGA members will renew their primary membership online.
- In May, primary DNTG chapter members will receive an email from EGA headquarters alerting you it's time to renew your membership. You then will be able to log onto www.egausa.org, visit the Chapter Map, select DNTG, and pay your national, region, and chapter dues. SCR Mid-Year Meeting Workshop - Boho Beaded Bead

Saturday February 17 after 1PM at

Try your hand at decorating a fabric wrapped bead, designed by Mikki Bonser, from the EGA August Stitch-a-long. <u>No beading experience required!</u> Carol Wallin will demonstrate the process of making a fabric bead by covering a paper straw, but you will work with fabric beads ready to be decorated with seed beads, sequins, threads, wire wrapping or anything else that can be stitched to, glued to, or wrapped around your fabric bead. Bring any leftover bits of Kreinik braids or fuzzy threads, buttons, charms, sequins, or lace that you have, as well as a sharp needle and your usual stitching supplies. Carol will provide written instructions, items from her bead stash for you to choose from, wire, and a clasp to make your bead into a scissor fob. Kit cost: \$5.00.
