
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The deadline for submission of written articles for publication in the newsletter is the 15th of the prior month.







The model was stitched on 28ct Antique White Cashel Linen by Zweigart. The finished size is approximately 9cm wide x 5cm high when stitched on this fabric count.

Stitch all cross stitches with two strands of DMC cotton floss over two linen threads or per aida square. For extra festive sparkle, sew glass seed beads in place using two strands of Golden Yellow (725) instead of cross stitching.

The **Royal School of Needlework** was founded in 1872 with a mission to preserve the art of hand embroidery.

To mark its 150th anniversary the RSN is launching the **RSN Stitch Bank** to continue this mission. The RSN Stitch Bank aims to digitally conserve and showcase the wide variety of the world's embroidery stitches and the ways in which they have been used in different cultures and times.

Launching with an initial 150 stitches, the RSN Stitch Bank is an ongoing project. More stitches will be added regularly and the RSN will be working with partners around the world to include stitches from different traditions.

For each stitch we need to:

- Film and edit a video demonstrating the making of the stitches.
- Create step by step text, illustrations and photos of the stitch's construction.
- Research a short history of the stitch and its use.
- Create an icon to help identify a stitch at a glance.
- Classify the stitch according to the taxonomy we are developing for the project.
- Select items from the RSN Collection which show this stitch in use and photograph the piece as a whole and of the stitch close up.

May - Luncheon and installation of new officers, presentation of sampler group project, and show & tell.


Passport of Stitches
